

For reference, local schools in the Wigan area we have offered vocational courses to are as follows: Deans Wood Trust (formally Abraham Guest School), St Peters High School, Deanery High School, St John Fisher, Hindley High School and Three Towers Centre. All pupils are currently working towards or already have qualifications with us.

We offer a unique learning environment for learners. Not only will they achieve qualifications in a state of the art learning environment, they will also gain experince in a working salon. This offers your learners a chance to gain a real feel for the industry they are about to join. We can also come into schools and deliver the theory sessions to help work with the schools time table. We will attend open evening, parents evening and school assembly when required to offer support.



The prospectus contains all the levels of courses available, cost, qualification and duration of a course.

Level 1 is ideal for starting out in the hair and beauty industry, and also gaining an understanding of the industry - Enough to succeed in a job or to move onto further study.

Hair and Beauty skills and techniques on themselves. Each unit in this qualification will enable learners to develop tehniques to help them care for themselves while gaining their understanding of beauty and hygiene products. There are really important self care skills that help learners to mix well with others, whether in education or a work environment. All units in this qualification have been designed as a foundation for further study learning at level 1 as a full time or part time learner.

Level 1 NVQ Certificate in Hairdressing and Barbering (QCF)

This qualification will provide learners with the basic knowledge and skills in preparation for a career as a barber or hairdresser. Throughout this qualification learners will ensure responsibility to reduce the risk of health and safety, prepare for hair services and maintain work areas, contribute to the development of effective working relationships and shampoo and condition hair option units will include blow dry, hair plait, twist hair using basic technique.

AM20530 VTCT Level 2 Certificate in Hairdessing and Beauty Therapy (VRQ)

The VTCT Level 2 Certificate in Hairdressing and Beauty Therapy (VRQ) is a Technical Award specifically for 14-16 year olds. This qualification aims support to young people to:

- Develop a broad and comprehensive understanding of the hair and beauty sector.
- Develop knowledge which spans the entire vocational sector and related industries.
- Develop academic and transferrable skills that will support progression within the hair and beauty sector

Hairdressing and beauty therapy has been and remains an extremely popular vocational area that many young people are unthused by and aspire to. The aim of this qualification is to use the hair and beauty sector as a vehicle to develop learners more broadly, so they are prepared and equipped with the knowledge, understanding and skills to pursue a career in any context

VTCT Level 2 Certificate Introduction to Make-Up

This qualification is about providing make-up services for a variety of occasions, including day, evening and special occasions. You will need to show you can work with a variety of skin types and conditions. The qualification covers the application of a wide range of make-up products to different skin tones and age groups. To carry out this qualification you will need to maintain effective health, safety and hygiene throughout your work. You will also need to maintain your personal appearance and good communication with the client. The main outcomes of the qualification are: Maintain safe and effective methods of working when providing make-up services. Consult, plan and prepare for make-up services. Apply make-up products. Provide aftercare advice.

| VTCT Level 3 Certificate in Fashion and<br>Photographic Make-Up  | The VTCT level 3 certificate in Fashion and Photographic Make-up is a vocationally related qualification based on National Occupational Standards (NOS) that will provide a wide variety of make-up services to a high level of occupational ability, to enable you to provide your own services for clients. This vocationally related qualification and includes all the required elements to develop your practical skills. The four mandatory units include the practical and theoretical knowledge required to provide fashion and photographic make-up services and monotoring and maintaining health and safety practises in the salon, to ensure all treatments are carried out with health and safety of yourself and you client, as a priority. The two remaining mandatory units provide the wider skills required to be a successful therapist of client care and communication in beauty related industries and promote and sell products and services. Both of these units address the need for a successful make-up artist to understand the importance of retail and client care. |
| VTCT Level 2 Award in Infection Prevention<br>(COVID-19) for Hairdressing and Barbering<br>Services (ITEC) | Aimed at hairdressers and barbers who need to understand the COVID-19 infection prevention methods required in the salon/barbershop in order to maintain high levels of health and safety in the provision of their services to clients. Throughout this qualification learners will develop knowledge on the importance of social responsibility, the causes transmission and effects of COVID-19, and the methods used to control transmission, such as correct hand hygiene and the use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). They will also gain an understanding of the safe working practive required in the salon/barbershop to protect themselves and clients. The primary purpose is to prepare learners to progress to further qualifications with an understanding of thenrole of infection prevention in relation to COVID-19   |

## Learning Support:


